Hebrews 12:4–24

⁶For the Lord disciplines the one he loves,

¹⁸For you have not come to what may be touched, a blazing fire and darkness and gloom and a tempest ¹⁹and the sound of a trumpet and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that no further messages be spoken to them. ²⁰For they could not endure the order that was given, "If even a beast touches the mountain, it shall be stoned." ²¹Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, "I tremble with fear." ²²But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering,

1. What was the first of Luther's 95 Theses?

When Luther posted his 95 theses to the church door in Wittenberg, sparking off the debate about salvation by grace known as the Reformation, his first thesis - the one that started it all was this: When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, "Repent," He willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance.

2. Why do those serving in the sanctuary of the church where vestments?

We believe Christ is truly present in our midst in His Word and Sacrament. Hidden things are being revealed, and revealed things are being hidden. The white garments worn by those serving in the sanctuary work to cover all the worldly parts of the servants to remind us that our true identity and standing before God is hidden. It is based entirely on His Word which covers us, which He describes as a white robe of Christ's righteousness. He has made us holy, but you cannot see it yet. And we need constant reminders of this gift of His because we certainly don't feel very holy. Yet every baptized believer looks like Christ on Transfiguration mountain to the Father in heaven, and every reminder of this reality helps us remember why we gather and who we gather around.
