Fifth Sunday After The Epiphany

How to prepare my heart for prayer and worship

When you enter the church, and finally have a time and place carved out of your busy life to quiet your soul and approach the King of souls, don't rush. Treat your heart tenderly, and let all its momentum exhaust itself within you as you sit/kneel quietly before God's altar. Keep your eyes shut, head bowed and hands still, so you can wait for the whirlwind within you to calm.

Then, when you are still - in body and soul - ask the Lord to open your heart a little wider than it was, so there is room for Him to enter in. Picture broadening your soul within you as you call on Him to bring His presence to bear upon you. And then continue to pray asking for the Holy Spirit to stir within you those deep prayers that He knows you need to utter. Pray them. Send them up to Him on the throne - to His altar. Give them over to Him, and see them leave you and become His own. Reflect on what's beneath them, and give these things to your King also.

Today close your eyes and picture yourself standing on the dark bottom of the Sea. Look up and see the faint outline of a boat lit up on the surface above you. It's cold where you are. Empty. But suddenly you hear a splash above you. A net swoops down and wraps you up. It hauls you up towards the light and the surface. You break through the water into the air and light. And there you see Him. It's Jesus. Standing there in front you. The net you are in has come from His mouth. He has pulled you up with His Word. He pulls you closer and closer to the boat, until you've fallen inside and lie before Him. You are terrified. His power overwhelms you. "Do not be afraid," He tells you, "my Word is for you. I speak it for you. My preachers are for you. I'm here to keep you from the Deep. And you're here to hear my Word." Now open your eyes. Look at the pulpit, the altar, the ceiling. You are still in the boat, and God's Word is about to pull you from the Deep, and hold you to Him.
